TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT

Year Ended 31 December 2024

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

Since May 2018, the church has been administered in accordance with the Unitary Constitution of The Church of Scotland.

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

The Kirk Session functions as the Board of Trustees comprising the elders of the church chosen from those who are considered to have the appropriate commitment, gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery. During a vacancy an Interim Moderator, appointed by Presbytery, assumes the powers and responsibilities of the Minister in terms of the Board of Trustees and in the business of the Session.

Organisational Structure

The Kirk Session meets nine times per year or as required. Under the Unitary Constitution, the Kirk Session has responsibility for the oversight and management of the Spiritual and Temporal affairs of the congregation.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in policy. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond. Strathbogie Drumblade congregation has ecumenical ties with Huntly Carinie Glass (Church of Scotland), St Margaret's (Roman Catholic) and Christ Church (Scottish Episcopal) congregations.

Morning Worship is held on Sundays at 10-30 am. At present, there are no designated children or teenage learning groups but the service includes an all-age reflection aimed at our younger attenders who are present with families. Full All-Age services are held throughout the year including Christmas Eve, Harvest Sunday, Palm Sunday, Easter Sunday and when there is a Baptism where children and youth are involved as much as possible. Crèche facilities are also available within the Sanctuary itself in a designated area. Church volunteers provide private transport to enable those challenged by mobility to attend Sunday worship. Our monthly communion which is offered on the first Sunday of the month using a shortened liturgy was resumed post Covid in January 2024. We continue to offer the Sacrament of Holy Communion in May and November when the full liturgy is used with around 90-100 attending.

After worship, fellowship and hospitality are offered in the Church Hall. Various special services take place throughout the year including:

- Thinking Day Service in February which involves Guide, Brownie, Scout and Cub leaders and young people, working together with the minister to devise and lead the 10.30 am service.
- Harvest Thanksgiving Service during which an offering is taken for a designated charity.
- Remembrance Sunday Service which is held, year about, between the two Huntly Church of Scotland congregations and involves Ex-Servicemen and women, the Huntly Pipe Band, the Community Council and the Uniformed Organisations with over 230 attending: it was held in SD this year.
- Early Christmas Eve Service aimed at participative all-age worship which in 2024 attracted a considerable number of children and adults.

The Guild has changed to meeting in the afternoon of every second Monday of the month from September to April with over 30 attending and including members of other denominations plus members of the community. Our branch supports national Guild Projects and has a twinning with another Guild branch in Elgin.

Pastoral Care is administered by the Locum Minister and Elders which includes the Ministry of Flowers involving flowers being taken to those who are ill, bereaved, housebound or commemorating a significant personal anniversary.

There are Monthly Services in the two Huntly Care Homes. The Locum Minister is supported by church members from both Strathbogie Drumblade and Huntly Cairnie Glass to swell the singing in worship, participate in readings and also to chat to residents afterwards. It is also an opportunity to visit in their rooms those unable to attend the worship. Special Services throughout the year included an 'Should Auld Acquaintance Be Forgot' act of worship and fellowship to remember those who have lost loved ones especially in the past year. An Ecumenical World Day of Prayer Service with participants from four local churches takes place and next year 2025 will be the turn of SD to host. The church also takes part in Racial Justice Sunday and Creation Time and reflects regularly on issues of Justice, Peace and Climate Change.

Both the local Primary School and the Secondary School chose to come to Strathbogie Drumblade for their Christmas services. The Locum Minister usually works with staff and pupils in both schools to enable the services to be jointly devised and led mainly by pupils. The Primary service was very well attended by pupils and their families but the Secondary Service was held in school as due to health issues the Locum was unable to go into school to work with pupils in the run up to Christmas.

Volunteer church members are involved in the maintenance of church property and grounds including the garden and the cleaning of the inside of the building. Post Covid we adhere strictly to national guidelines for health, safety and hygiene in public buildings.

The congregation supports the local Foodbank and the local Baby Bank intimating each Sunday what is needed and reminding members where they can donate. Our Advent Appeal was for the Baby Bank with members contributing both items and money at a time when young families were struggling with the costs of Christmas.

Coffee mornings are held in the town hall during the year for fundraising:

- Guild for its local, national, overseas projects
- Church fabric purposes, and / or disaster relief,

Achievements and Performance

2024 found the congregation continuing to operate in a vacancy period. Our most important achievements were:

- Maintaining energy, faith, mission and focus in this a fifth year of vacancy
 while continuing to engage with the Presbytery's Planning and Deployment
 Committee and Vacancy Procedure Committee, and also with our sister,
 congregation, Huntly Cairnie Glass in respect of the Deferred Union.
- Continuing to keep contact and connection with our members of all ages through visits including the delivery of church flowers, telephone calls, emails, and the sharing of pastoral information with the Locum.
- Holding Family Ceilidhs as a way to provide a connection in the community especially for families. These are held in the town hall and raise funds for the church.
- Developing the Friendship Club every Tuesday afternoon in the church hall. It
 is open to anyone in the community. The club aims to provide a warm and
 safe space, where anyone can come to find company or a listening ear.
 Various table games such as dominoes are also provided as well as
 tea/coffee and 'a fine piece'.
- Continuing reach out to families and children in special All-Age services and events.

Closure of Drumblade Building

The Drumblade building was closed for Worship on 1st May 2016. The building was sold through the Church of Scotland Law Department. (See Reserves Policy)

FINANCE REPORT

Strathbogie Drublade Church, including the Guild, ended the year with a deficit of 9944.00. However, after a part transfer of 2240.00, and a Legacy of 7500.00, we finished on an overall deficit of 204.00.

On reflection on the 2024 Annual Accounts, the following observations are relevant.

Overall Receipts show a reduction from the previous year, despite regular Church giving.

Expenditure was broadly in line with expectation, but two items of costs show a substantial increase, namely Repairs and Maintenance, as well as Heat and Light. It would appear that the 2025 year will also incur a far higher cost element for Heat and Light.

RESERVE POLICY

At the year end, Strathbogie Drumblade Church held combined Current and Deposit Bank Balances, plus Investments, with The Church of Scotland Growth and Income Fund, totalling 138028. In addition, there is an Endowment Fund, named The Brander Trust where the value is shown as 1000.00.

STATED RESERVE POLICY

It continues to be the policy of the Treasurer, supported by member of the Finance Committee, to look after the Funds of Strathbogie Drumblade Church. The objective is to hold a balance of Bank Funds, allied to Investments, capable of meeting our obligations with ease of liquidity being of the 'upmost importance'.

Our Holdings of Cash and Investments are carefully monitored and details are given to Session Members at our regular meetings.

Present Holdings are considered to be adequate for the daily running of our Church.

An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.


