#### **Trustees' Annual Report**

#### Year Ended 31 December 2019

#### Structure, Governance and Management

#### **Governing Document**

Church administration is followed in Accordance with the Unitary Constitution.

#### Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk session are the charity trustees. The Kirk session members are the Elders of the Church and are chosen from those members of the Church who are considered to have the appropriate commitment, gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

#### **Organisational Structure**

The Kirk Session which meets six times a year, or as required, is responsible, under the Unitary Constitution, for both Spiritual and Temporal affairs within the church.

#### **Objectives and Activities**

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

- \*Morning Worship is held on Sundays at 10-30am with Trailblazers (P1-7) present during the early part of the Service before leaving for their own teaching activities in Church Halls until the end of the service.
- \* Orders of Service are printed weekly with large print copies available.
- \* Crèche facilities are available.
- \* The Community minibus manned by Church volunteers transports the elderly and frail to Church each week.
- \* All age services are held several times a year with children and young people participating.
- \* Formal Communion is held in May and November at 10-30am, in addition a short Communion service is held once a month at the end of Morning Worship.
- \* Teas and coffees are available each Sunday after Morning Worship in the hall.
- \* Harvest Thanksgiving Service in October, with gifts going to the local Foodbank.
- \* All Saints Day Evening Service of Remembrance in November.
- \* Remembrance Sunday Service and Thinking Day Services, are held in conjunction with Huntly Cairnie Glass Parish Church.
- \* Christmas Eve Service at 6pm, an interactive service with carols for children, youth and families, retiring offering to *Inspire* (local charity).
- \* The Guild meets twice a month between September and April and has 22 members.
- \* The Church Magazine is produced quarterly by the Magazine and Publicity Committee and is distributed to homes by volunteers from the congregation.
- \* Ministry of flowers to sick, bereaved and housebound.
- \* Monthly Services in two nursing and care homes are conducted by the minister and supported by several members of the congregation.
- \* Primary School and Secondary School Christmas Services were held in the Church in December.
- \* Volunteer Church members: are involved in the Maintenance of Church property, Church Cleaning on a Rota basis and the upkeep of the Church garden.

- \* Supporting Local Food Bank through individual collection of foodstuffs.
- \* Coffee mornings are held three times a year specifically for fundraising purposes by The Guild, Trailblazers and by the Church with proceeds going either towards fabric purposes and/or disaster relief.

#### Achievements and Performance

Guild Members and Office Bearers have attended various Guild events locally and nationally throughout the year. The Guild has donated financially in support of several charities at home and abroad and in support of national Guild Projects.

Safe-guarding -- All volunteers up to date on PVG register.

Hand knitted baby clothes and blankets continue to be sent to Nkhoma Hospital Malawi and knitting is also underway by Guild members on behalf of the Sailors Society.

World Day of Prayer – In March Guild members participated in a short service in the local care home and in the full evening ecumenical service held in Christ Church.

#### Financial Review

Strathbogie Drumblade Church (including the Guild and Trailblazers) ended the year in deficit by £31,093. However due to the necessity of part transferring of our investments of £26,645 we finished the year with a deficit of £4,450.

With regard to 2019 figures, overall receipts were comparable with 2018. Expenditure overall increased by under £8,500 with several cost centres lower. Fabric, Repairs and Maintenance continues to be a major charge on the accounts with this year being no exception due to high cost of maintenance work repipework/asbestos.

Overall, our bank position is considered satisfactory.

#### Reserves Policy

At this year end, Strathbogie Drumblade Church held combined Current and Deposit Bank Balances, plus investments at Church of Scotland Growth and Income Fund of £130,397.

In addition, there is an Endowment Fund named the Brander Trust, where the value is shown at £1,000.

#### Stated Reserves Policy

It is the policy of the Treasurer, and the members of the Finance Committee, to have a balanced approach with regards to liquidity of Investments held, allied to Bank funds available, in order to meet our obligations. At present our mix of Cash and Investments held is considered prudent, but still holding a position to meet any unexpected expenditure.

#### Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session acting under the Unitary Constitution must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities. 

#### Strathbogie Drumblade Parish Curch Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees Year ended 31 December 2019

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2019 which are set out on pages 5 to 8

#### Respective Responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.
